


Rakhi, the precious bond of love



in routine, boredom and lack of innovative ideas

*Some children have expressed lower levels of stress for not being able to play outdoors, not meeting friends.

*Behavioral and Emotional Disorders in Children symptoms of mood swings, fear, difficulty in

concentration, , poor appetite and being irritable are common psychological conditions noticed

during lockdown

*The most painful is— More than a million children have fallen into extreme poverty

To thrive from such conditions – A secure family environment is required. Which the parents

can provide is a strong protective environment.

Restrict screen time and news time for children. Engage them in creative activities, in diet more

of green vegetables and fresh fruits and less of carbohydrates, specially sweets and junk foods.
