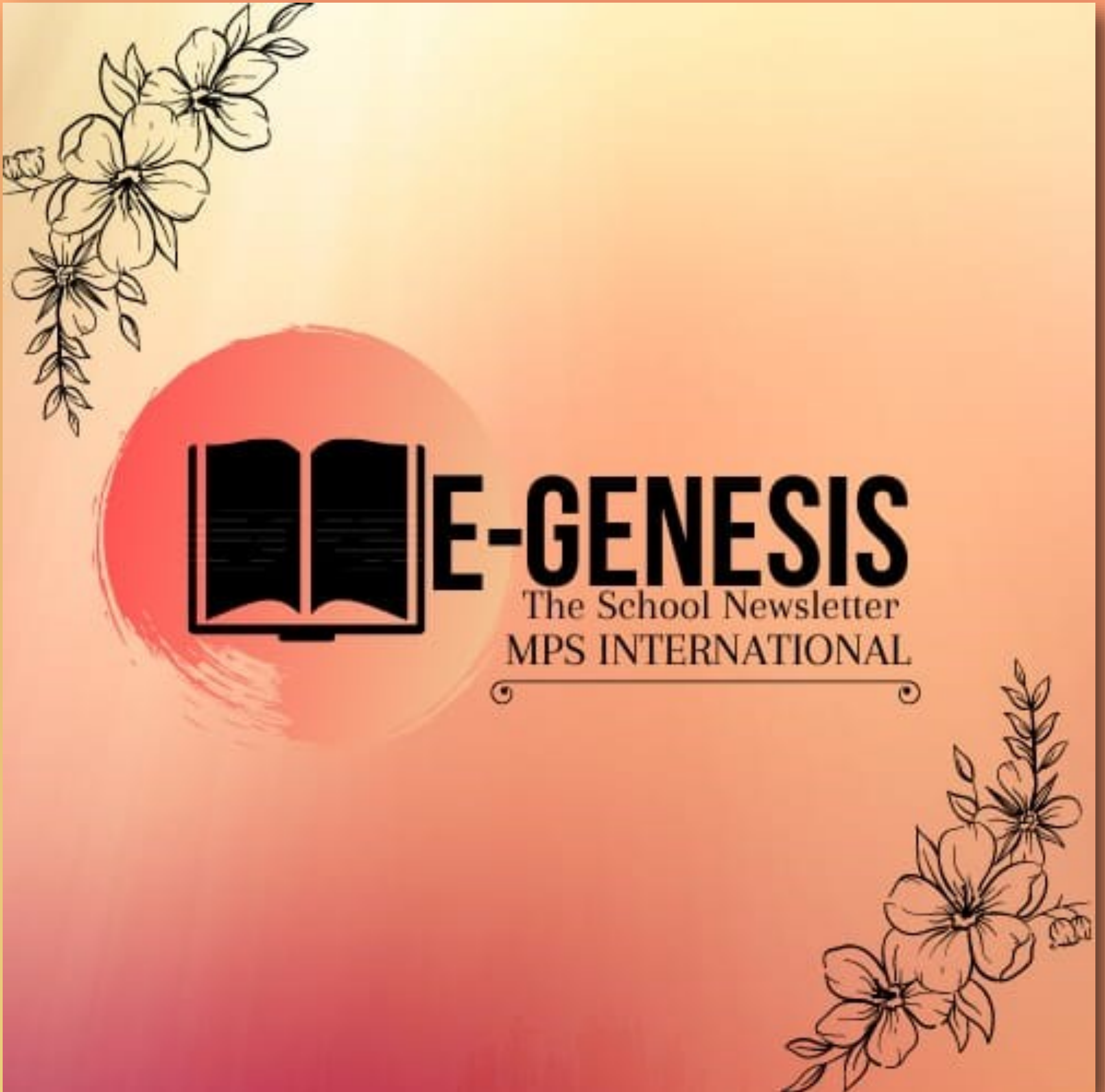

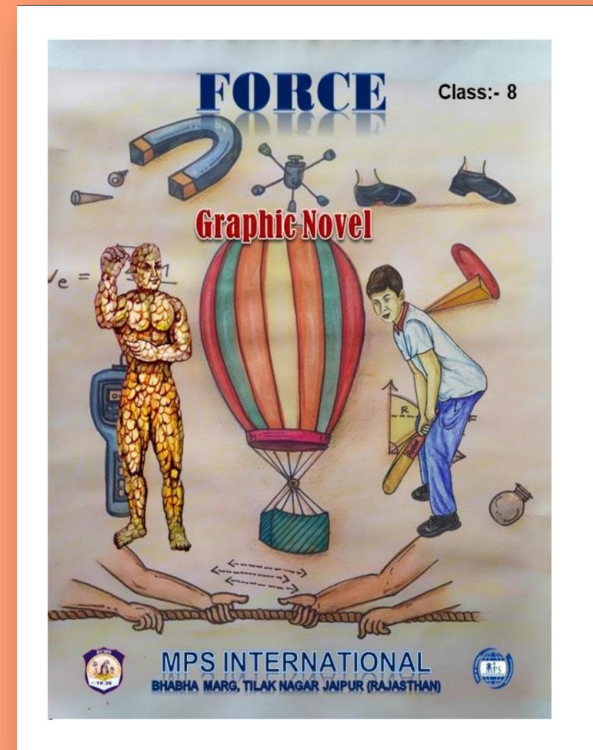

Celebrating Christmas Eve

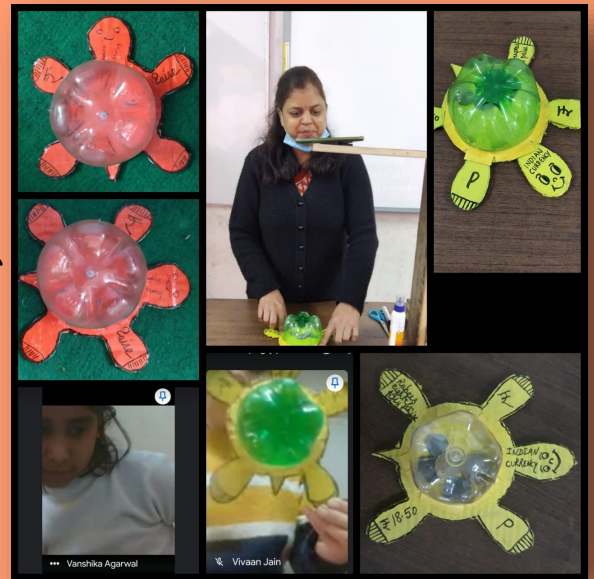

Worshipping Tulsi in school premises

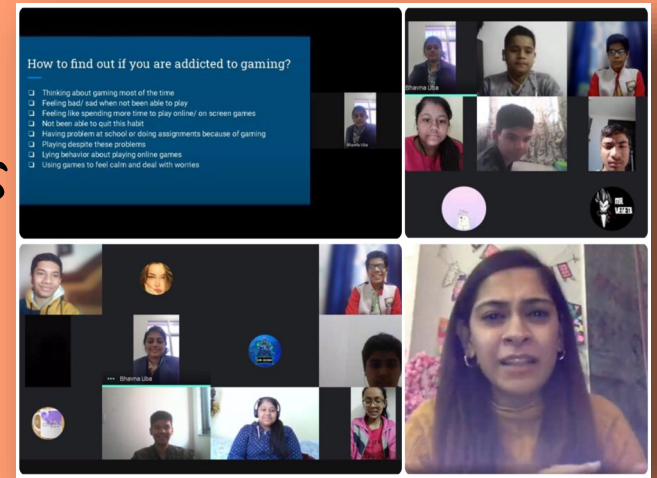

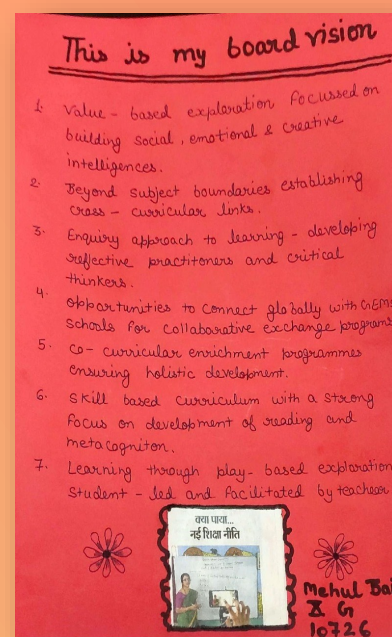
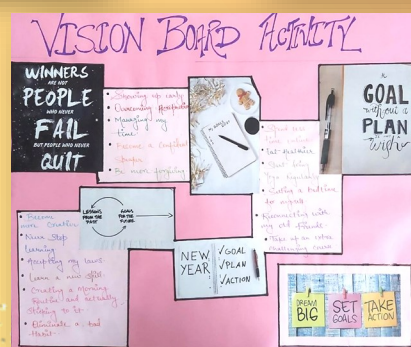
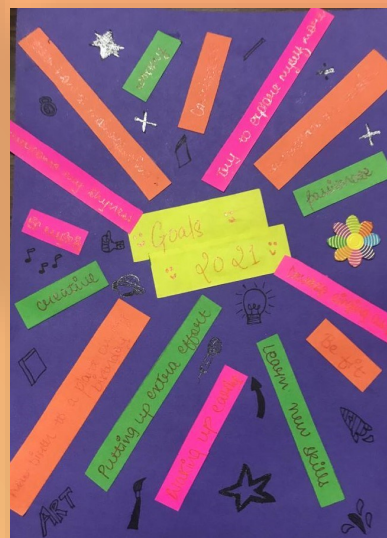
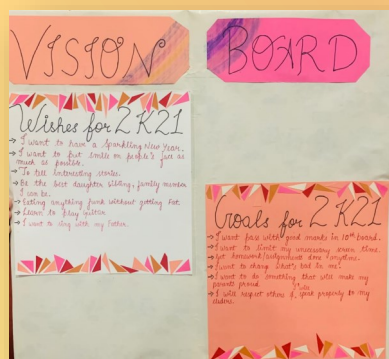
Our students bag 2 prizes in UFYLC MUN 5.0

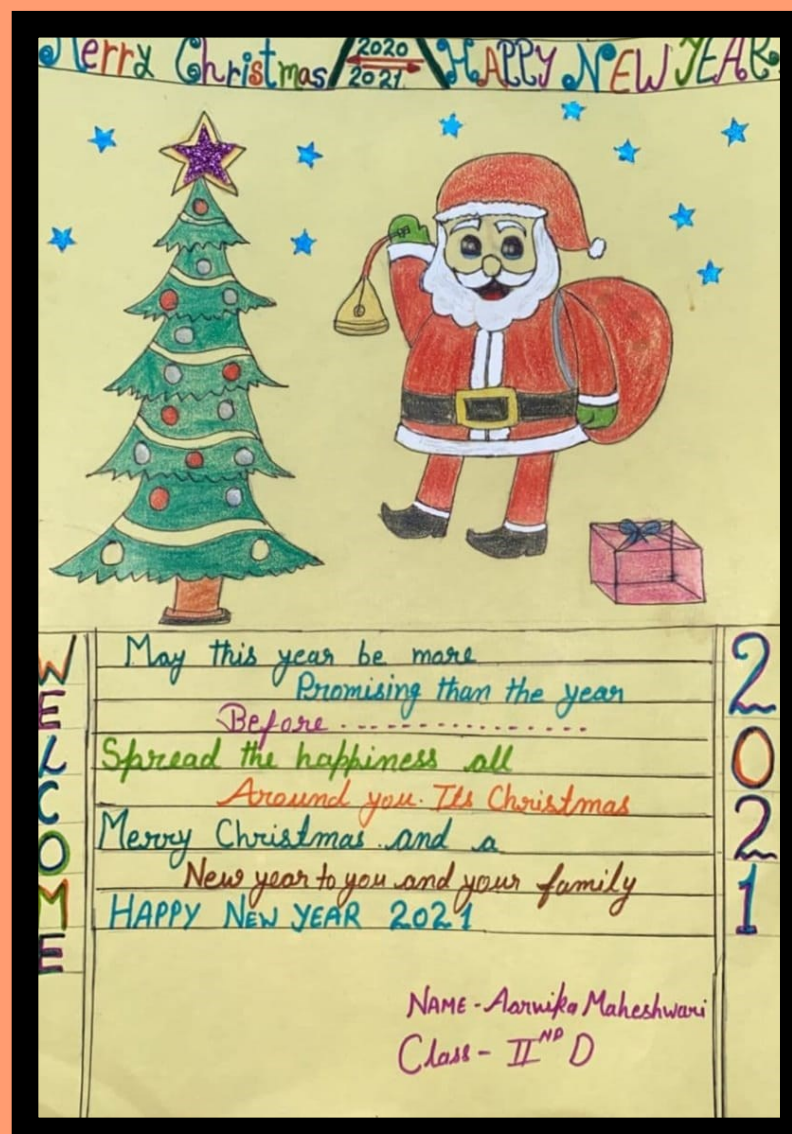

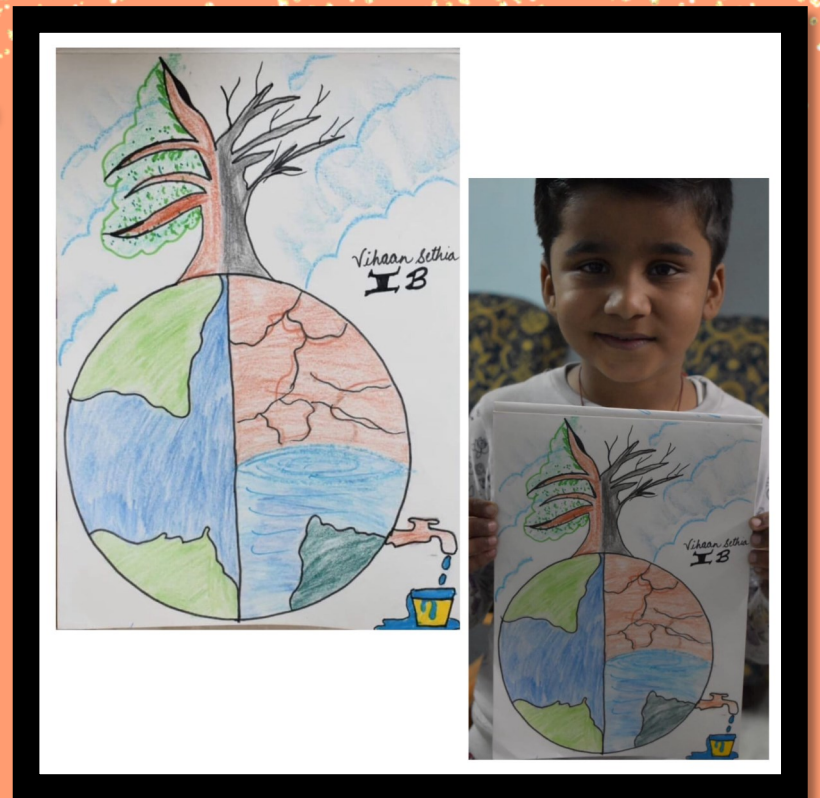
