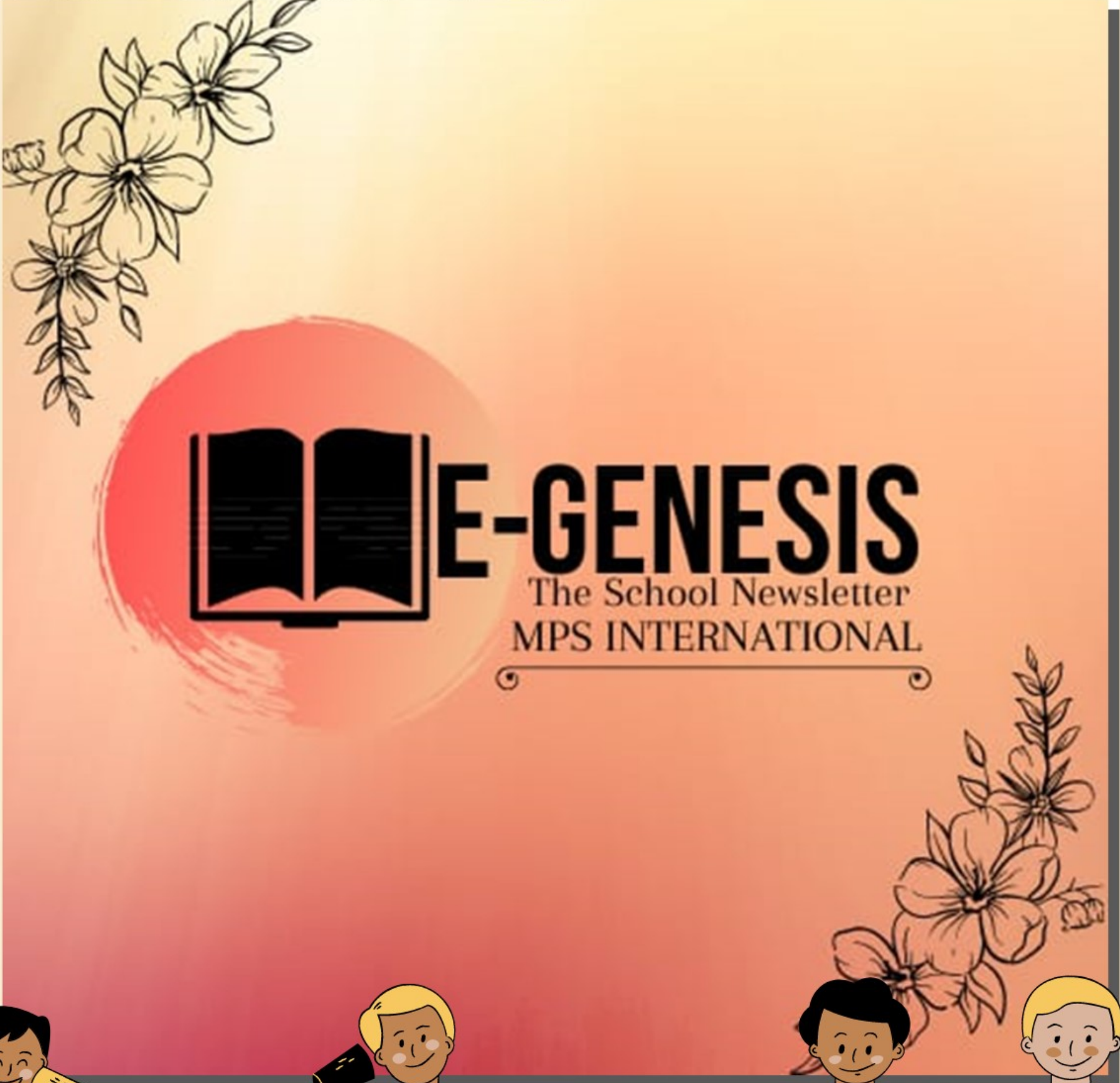

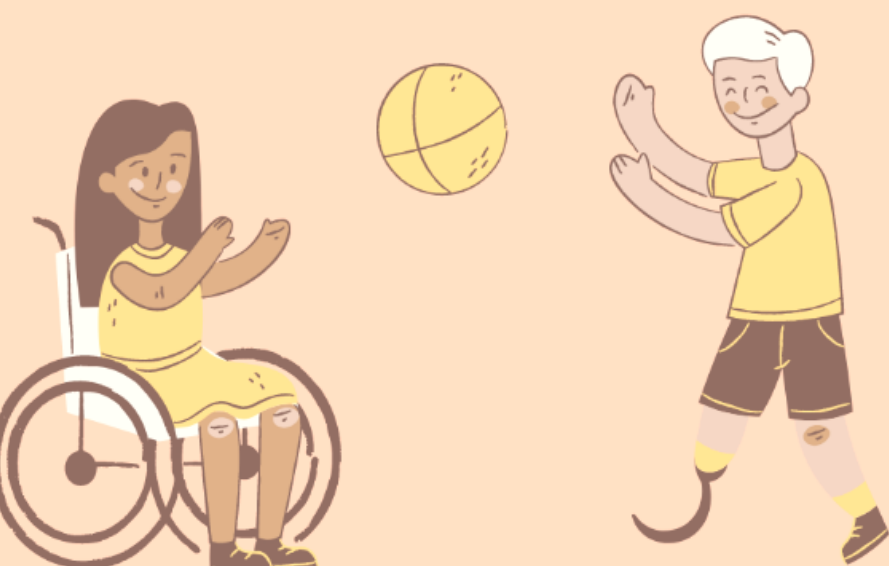
“Every accomplishment starts with the decision to try”

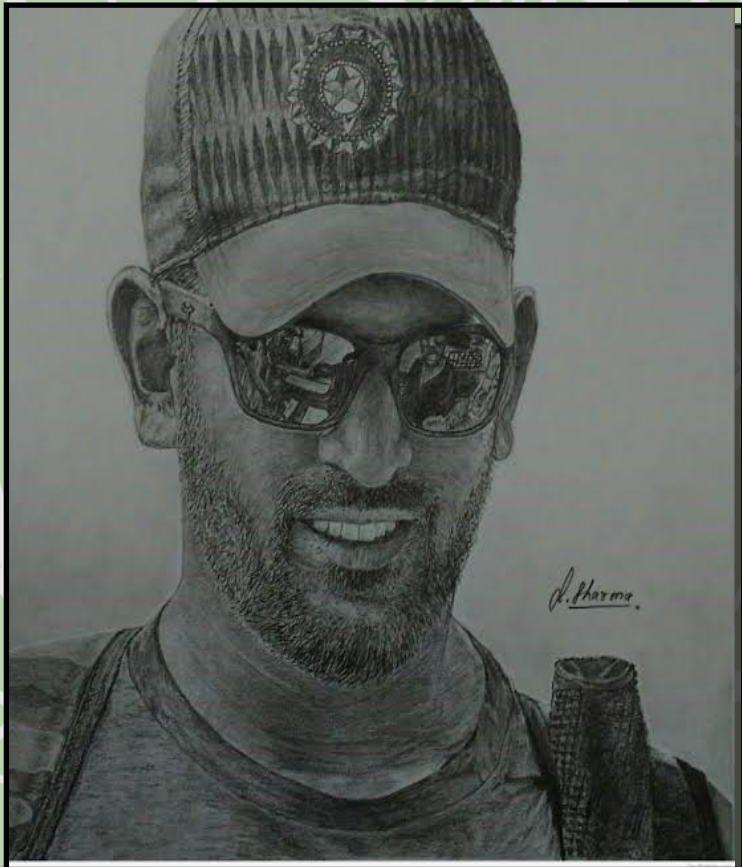
LIFE
