"Today is bad, tomorrow may be worst but a day after that will surely bring a sunshine."



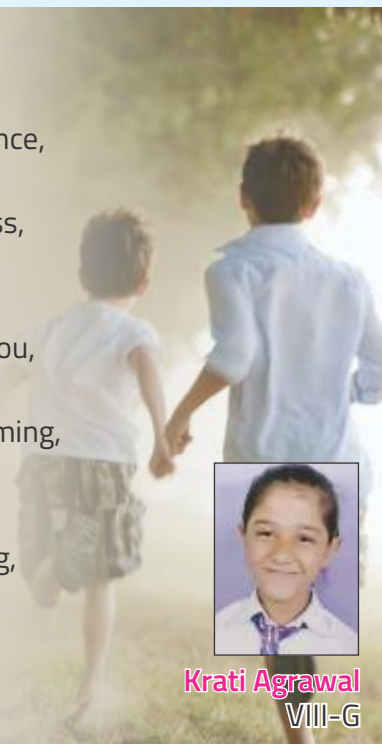
